**Women Working Wonders**! have been very active this past year and remains so in the upcoming season.

This past Spring, we sold **WAWA** coupons—made a profit of \$450. June 22<sup>nd</sup>, we held a fundraiser at **Inside Scoop**, Coopersburg, and made \$195.

**Upcoming: August 24**, we will be holding a fundraiser at **Drizzle Ice Cream** in Alburtis—they will provide us with 15% of their total proceeds for the entire day. You don't need to announce CHC or provide any paperwork—just go and enjoy some ice cream. They also have Penn State ice cream available for sale.

September 30, 10 am to 2 pm, at Lower Milford Fire House, Limeport Pike, we will be holding our first Basket Raffle, which has the potential to be a huge success. We have received some phenomenally wonderful donations, (including free dinners at local restaurants, free services, lots and lots of filled baskets with tons of goodies), as well as free admissions to museums and events in, nearby, and outside the Valley. We have also received some impressive large grand prize items. Tickets will be sold at the door, \$5/25 tickets; grand prize tickets slightly more. We will begin drawing the winners at 2 pm. Winners will be called to pick up their prizes—we are hoping that most of the winners will be on the premises or nearby in order to pick up their prizes quickly. Any remaining prizes will need to be transported back to the church until pickups can be arranged. In addition, we will be selling crockpot soups, hot dogs, baked goods, etc. All monies from the raffle will go toward our Mission donations to those less fortunate than ourselves in the community—monies from the food sales will go toward the fuel bill at the church.

**October 21, 2023, Hoagie Sale:** our hoagie sales have been popular and we plan another sale from the same vendor. WWW makes the hoagies at the church the morning of Oct. 21; pickup will be from 11 am to 1 pm in the Fellowship Hall. [There will not be any baked goods or raffle baskets this year since we will be doing the Basket Raffle the month prior.]

**Holiday Shoeboxes:** we will be filling shoeboxes again in November. We will be asking for donations of small toys, etc., to use to fill the shoeboxes in the upcoming months.

#### Wreaths Across America:

Wreaths Across America will be held on **Saturday, December 16, 2023, 10am.** WAA is a 501 (c)(3) nonprofit organization founded to continue and expand the annual wreath-laying ceremony at Arlington National Cemetery begun by Maine businessman Morrill Worcester in 1992. The organizations' mission – Remember, Honor, Teach – is carried out in part each year by coordinating wreathlaying ceremonies in December at Arlington, as well as at more than 2,500 veterans' cemeteries and other locations in all 50 states and overseas. Through this national program, WAA has given back more than \$20 million in local contributions over the last 15 years! Last year, more than 4,000 locations participated in National Wreaths Across America Day. Chestnut Hill Church, an official WAA location, will host a wreath-laying ceremony for National WAA Day.

As in past years, the Hoff Endowment is sponsoring the cost of the wreaths for our Church. Our goal is to place a live, balsam fir veteran's wreath at the headstone of every service member buried at CHC and ensure no one is forgotten. Grave specific wreaths can be placed on family members' headstones. Please consider volunteering to help us place wreaths on our headstones on December 16, 2023.
