Quarterly Town Hall Meeting Recap

The first Town Hall Meeting since the beginning of COVID occurred on Sunday, May 23, 2021, following the worship service. It allowed a time to provide information to members regarding the ongoing business of Chestnut Hill Church, which continued throughout the Pandemic.

The first subject discussed was a water leak that was discovered due to a water pressure drop during ongoing construction work on the church building. Thanks to Glenn Snyder, Harry Rupp, and Debbie Koder, members of the Board of Trustees/Property Maintenance team; they all played an integral part in making sure this was taken care of promptly so that church services that Sunday would not be cancelled.

Ongoing repairs to the church building were discussed, along with information provided on the level of aging damage of the building, additional damage discovered, and how funds would be used from the Miller Endowment Fund to cover repair costs. Additionally, information regarding replacement of the Fellowship Hall flooring was provided.


Also discussed was how the church has many committees/teams that are in short supply of additional help to carry out their responsibilities. A challenge was made to the members of the congregation to prayerfully consider how they can best use their own gifts and talents to assist a committee/team of their choice. Becca Bogart volunteered to lead a Visitation Team whose responsibility would be to ensure continued connection between the church and its members. If anyone is interested in being a part of this effort, please let her know. Also, if anyone has a desire to be connected with any of the other teams with an interest to offer support, please contact a member of Council and you will be provided contact information of that specific committee/team.

The congregation was reminded of the limitations upon Pastor's time of which Pastor shared he was going to focus on his three major responsibilities to provide sermons, (a cohesive worship service that can continue to be streamed to members and the community who do not wish to or cannot participate in the physical worship service), and visitation. Pastor's ability to arrange and prepare for video recordings that support the theme presented each Sunday add to its delivery so that he can convey the Good News in multiple ways so as many people as possible can participate.

Finally, many members spoke of the relaxing of the mask requirements in PA and, with a unanimous show of hands, many felt the mask requirements at the church should follow suit. The church still requests that those that have not been fully vaccinated continue to wear a mask, but that they are no longer mandatory for all. Social distancing will remain in effect (the pews will continue to be roped off to allow for that) and windows will be kept open with fans running to allow for air flow whenever possible.

To allow for continued communication between the church and its members, additional Town Hall meetings are anticipated to be scheduled on a quarterly basis.

Why do chair yoga?

Just like other forms of yoga, chair yoga provides a number of health benefits – and it's accessible to most people. There are several reasons to give it a try. Yoga is said to:

Enhance strength, endurance, and flexibility

Enhance focus and mental clarity

Improve balance

Provide for some pain and fatigue relief

Provide stress relief

The class will be led by Cindy Buchter, MEd, LPC, RYT-200 (Registered Yoga Alliance Yoga Teacher). Cindy has been providing private individual and small group sessions in the community and is excited to offer this form of yoga to Chestnut Hill Church members, friends of members, and anyone else that is interested in participating from the community.

While the class is offered freely, free will-donations will be accepted for the use of the church building and facilities. Most instructions and postures do not require any additional props; however, you may find bringing the following items helpful to you in your practice:

A yoga strap (an old necktie can also be used)

A tennis ball

Yoga blocks

A bath towel that can be rolled up

The class will run for 8 weeks, from July 1, 2021, until August 19, 2021, and will take place in the Fellowship Hall with windows open or air conditioning running to allow for air flow. Chairs will be spaced apart to allow for distancing. Upon arrival at your first class, you will be asked to sign a waiver in order to participate. **Class size will be limited, so it is highly recommended that you call Cindy prior to the start time of class to reserve a spot. For the continued comfort of all, the mask mandates as outlined on the PA Health website when checked on 6/9/2021 (at [Responding to COVID-19 | PA.GOV:](#)) will be followed:

- COVID-19 mitigation measures have been lifted in Pennsylvania.
- The masking order will be lifted on June 28 or when 70 percent of adults are fully vaccinated, whichever comes first. ([Our class starts after this date](#))
- Fully vaccinated Pennsylvanians may choose not to wear a mask, unless they are required by a business or organization. ([We are no longer requiring masks be worn by individuals who have been fully vaccinated](#))

Neighbors in Need Offering: Neighbors in Need (NIN) is a special mission offering of the United Church of Christ that supports ministries of justice and compassion throughout the United States. One-third of NIN funds support the Council for American Indian Ministry (CAIM). Two-thirds of this offering is used by the UCC's Justice and Witness Ministries (JWM) to support a variety of justice initiatives, advocacy efforts, and direct service projects through grants. Neighbors in Need grants are awarded to UCC churches and organizations doing justice work in their communities. These grants fund projects whose work ranges from direct service to community organizing and advocacy to address systemic injustice. This year, this special offering will be collected on World Communion Sunday (October 3) and will go to support projects like this one...In South Carolina, Peace Congregational United Church of Christ Congregation members and the Clemson community are working side-by-side in the design and construction of a tiny house, a mobile residency for a person in the LGBTQ community who is no longer welcome at home. The \$20,000 project is in progress with the help of a \$10,000 Grasstop Grant from UCC Justice and Witness Ministries, the first occupant could be ready to find refuge there in January. Please consider giving to these ministries!
