A Letter from Pastor Linda

Dear Church Family,

Greetings Sisters and Brothers,

My husband and I recently took a few days off for some good old-fashioned rest and relaxation. No touring, no visiting, no long lines. One afternoon sitting in the yard with my feet propped up and the sun shining, I was suddenly aware of peace: peace in my heart, mind, body, and soul. Peace and quiet; the only thing I could hear was the chirping of the birds. No traffic, no neighbors, no dogs barking, no television; nothing! It is not that I can't or don't find peace in other places or at other times, but I realized in that moment how long it had been since I had taken the time to sit and be still and bask in the peace of my Creator and His creation.

The word 'peace' can be found 340 times in the Bible (NRSVUE). In the hours before Jesus was to be crucified, he said to his disciples: "The hour is coming, indeed it has come, when you will be scattered, each one to his home, and you will leave me alone. Yet I am not alone because the Father is with me. I have said this to you so that in me you may have peace. In the world you face persecution, but take courage: I have conquered the world!" (John 16:31-33). A quick search provided me with other words for persecution, including mistreatment, provoking, and galling. Galling – now that's a word we don't use often, but what if instead we replaced that with other similar words like infuriating, exasperating, tiresome or troublesome.

Our world right now is in quite a mess and while we personally don't face persecution, if you're like me perhaps you are often infuriated, exasperated, and tired. Perhaps like me, you might even pray, "Come, Lord Jesus, come!" As we approach the season of Advent and rejoice together in the birth of our Savior, I would encourage you to seek peace and to help others do the same. In this often hectic, busy time of celebrating, I invite you to go out in peace, extend peace, hold your peace and be at peace, that it may be well with your soul!

Jesus said: **Peace** I leave with you; my **peace** I give to you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled, and do not let them be afraid (John 14:27).

Finance Team

Cemetery Board

The cemetery board had their quarterly meeting on October 18th. Jeff reported that the legal documents have been signed to release the Trust Funds in the name of Charles Johnson to the Cemetery Fund, awaiting court approval. The cemetery board will have the deteriorating wall taken down next Spring. The cost of repairing is prohibitive. The landscaping that will replace it will be decided at that time. Many suggestions have been given and we appreciate your concern. Two grave plots have been sold so far this year. There were 4 burials in the third quarter and so far, two in the fourth quarter.

Betty Lou's Pantry

There is a bin in the lower Narthex for donations for Betty Lou's Pantry. We will take the donations along after service every Sunday. We need everything in the core food groups but especially: Tuna, Canned Fruit (peaches, pears, pineapples), Pasta Sauces, Tomatoes, Jelly, Canned corn. Although small, Chestnut Hill Church has the best reputation for donations to BLP. All donations are very appreciated. There has been a big increase in families that are utilizing the food pantry distribution. Thank you so much for your thoughtful donations for those less fortunate than ourselves.

Outside the Church

Women Working Wonders!

WWW has been very, very active and busy for 2023. We've held some amazing fundraisers and been able to bulk up our financial line so that we will be able to support the amazing organizations in the Lehigh Valley who help and aid those individuals/families less fortunate than ourselves.

March: we filled over 800 plastic Easter eggs with candy for the Children's Home of Easton, thanks to the generous donations from our congregation.

<u>June</u>: we sold WAWA hoagie coupons—made about \$450 profit. Inside Scoop (Coopersburg) ice cream fundraiser—made \$195 profit.

August: Drizzle (Alburtis) ice cream fundraiser—about \$160 profit.

<u>September</u>: Basket Social fundraiser—profit of almost \$6,000 total (food profits of nearly \$600) will go towards the fuel bill at CHC). Although this was our first-ever basket social, we had an amazing amount of donations (over 200 regular baskets, and many higher priced/grand prizes) from all over—many from outside the Lehigh Valley (Philly, Hershey, Poconos, Camden, Doylestown, etc.)—thanks to the work of the Slota family, who created an Internet link to advertise and allow many to link in and share. The day of the event proved to be very popular—from before the event was scheduled to begin to the drawings, there was a continuous stream of folks. Just perfect—not too crowded at any one time. The food sold out—we had 6 crockpots of soups, hot dogs, tons of baked goods, etc. We definitely plan to do this again next year—save Saturday, October 5, 2024 (we will set up the day before at the Limeport Fire House).

October: We held our annual hoagie sale. The prices of the meat, rolls, etc., had really gone up, but we had kept our price the same—we made almost \$600 profit. Since October is such a busy time of year, we plan to hold our 2024 hoagie sale April 20th. More info will be forthcoming as we get closer to that date.

November:

WWW will be helping CHC in the collection of winter coats and apparel to support the nonprofit "Fostering Hope" event sponsored by The Children's Home of Easton on November 19. The winter clothing and accessories drive, benefitting children and youth in foster care. If you'd like to support this event, please bring a new item to the church no later than Sunday, November 19th. Suggested items include new coats, snowsuits, scarves, hats, gloves. Sizes newborn to Adult XL. In addition, diapers/pullups (all sizes) and toiletries. Toiletries include: hairbrushes; tooth brushes; toothpaste; deodorant; feminine products; shampoo, conditioner and body wash (baby, child and adult). Craig and Grace Adams will take our contributions to the Children's Home of Easton following worship on November 19th.

Holiday Shoeboxes: We will also be wrapping Holiday Hope Chests (shoeboxes). We could use wrapping paper, scotch tape, and items to put into the shoeboxes.

We are still looking for small toys, games, socks, underwear, toiletries, etc. to fill the boxes – ages are from 2-12, boys and girls. No religious items or war-type items please. The bulletin board in the Fellowship Hall has a list of needs for the shoe boxes.

We will be filling and wrapping the boxes at the next WWW meeting, November 20th at 6 PM. Everyone is welcome to help.

The wrapped shoeboxes need to be delivered November 30th.

WWW will determine to which organizations we wish to donate at our November meeting (11/20, 6 pm). Anyone/everyone is always welcome to come join us as we move forward to support those who can use our help. [We have sent \$500 to Family Promise earlier this month to help reunite a family separated by the Ukrainian war.]

WWW meetings are held the 3rd Monday of the month, 6 pm. All are welcome. **Women Working Wonders!** have been very active this past year and remains so in the upcoming season. Also, any ideas of who and how we can help those in the community is always welcomed.

Annual Gift Card Fundraiser Program is back.

Our gift card programs makes your Christmas gift giving easier! You pay for the value of the gift card and the the % next to your card is the amount that CHC will earn. The cards are secure. You save gas, no running around to purchase the cards. The cards will be ordered December 1 and they will be delivered to CHC on Sunday December 10. All money raised from the gift cards will go to the fuel bill, to help keep us warm this winter.
